**\*AZ State Parks entrance fees increased on 2/25/25. The fee is now based on the number of people in a vehicle, if no one has a park pass. The fee is \$10 for one person and \$20 for 2 – 4 people total. The fee should be split among those in the vehicle. A park pass allows for up to 4 people to enter without charge.**

**Tuesday, May 5th, 2026, Walter's Cascade/Stock Tank (C/5mi./800ft./\$4.00/7:00am)** Meet behind the Welcome Center before 7:00 am. Bring your Catalina park pass if you have one. We will park at the picnic area after crossing the CDO wash. We will hike across the road and follow the trail up the SW side of Alamo Canyon for about a mile. Then take a side trail that goes up to the stock tank. There are a couple of short, steep rocky areas on the trail so poles are recommended. **Friday, May 8, 2026, Exploratory Spring Birding on Mt. Lemmon [C/max 7 miles/max 1400'/\$11/6:15 am]** This is planned as a full day of high elevation birding on Mt. Lemmon (our stops will be at elevations of 7,000-9,200 feet). May and June are absolutely the best birding months up on Mt. Lemmon because our high elevation songbirds have returned to breed. They're actively calling and moving around to set up territories, making them easier to find. I'm calling it an exploratory hike because I will not have time to check out all the trails before we head up, though they're all ones I've been on in previous years. We'll meet behind the Welcome Center to carpool up to our first stop, Rose Canyon Lake for a few miles of hiking/birding. From there we'll make a shorter stop at Incinerator Ridge, where Red-faced Warblers are frequent nesters before heading up to Summerhaven and the ski valley. Lunch will be in one of the picnic areas and if there's time, we'll stop for treats/refreshments before heading down the mountain. As always, we'll let the birds set our pace and for this day, we'll be conscious of the challenges of elevation hiking as well. I have a spare pair of binoculars if anyone needs them.
