* AZ State Park entrance fees increased on 2/25/25. The fee is now based on the number of people in a vehicle, if no one has a park pass. The fee is \$10 for one person and \$20 for 2-4 people total. The fee should be split among those in the vehicle. A park pass allows for up to 4 people to enter without additional charge.
